THE BONDS WILL NOT BE DESIGNATED AS "QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT" OBLIGATIONS FOR FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS.

BONDS OFFERED FOR SALE AT COMPETITIVE BID: The Board of Directors (the "Board") of McKinney Municipal Utility District No. 2 of Collin County (the "District") is offering for sale at competitive bid \$13,300,000 Unlimited Tax Bonds, Series 2026 (the "System Bonds").

METHODS FOR SUBMISSION OF BIDS AND BID FORMS: Bids for the System Bonds may be submitted by any one of the following methods:

1. Submit bids in writing as described below under "WRITTEN BIDDING PROCEDURE."
2. Submit bids electronically as described below under "ELECTRONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE."
3. Submit bids by telephone as described below under "TELEPHONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE."

All bids must be submitted by 9:00 A.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026. Any prospective bidder must also submit, by 9:00 A.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026, signed Official Bid Form(s) to the District's financial advisor, Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC (the "Financial Advisor"), as more fully described below. Any bid or bid form submitted after such scheduled time for bid receipt will not be accepted and will be returned unopened. The District will not accept bids by facsimile transmission. See "CONDITIONS OF SALE – REQUIRED DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTIES" for additional requirements concerning submission of bids.

WRITTEN BIDDING PROCEDURE: A prospective bidder that intends to submit its bid in writing must do so in accordance with this paragraph. Two (2) sealed bids, which must be submitted on the Official Bid Form and plainly marked "Bid for Bonds," are to be addressed to "President and Board of Directors, McKinney Municipal Utility District No. 2 of Collin County." The two (2) sealed bids must be submitted on signed Official Bid Forms and delivered, by 9:00 A.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026, to the office of the Financial Advisor, as follows: Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC, Attn: Stephen Eustis, 4801 Woodway Drive, Suite 118-E, Houston, Texas 77056. For purposes of the written bidding procedure, the time as maintained by PARITY (defined below) shall constitute the official time.

ELECTRONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE: A prospective bidder that intends to submit an electronic bid must submit its electronic bid through the facilities of PARITY. A prospective bidder that intends to submit an electronic bid must also submit, prior to 9:00 A.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026, one (1) signed copy of the Official Bid Form that is executed by an authorized representative of the bidder, but otherwise incomplete, to Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC, Attn: Stephen Eustis, by email to the following address: seustis@cedarcreekma.com. Subscription to the PARITY/BIDCOMP Electronic Bid Submission System ("PARITY") is required in order to submit an electronic bid. The District will neither confirm any subscription nor be responsible for the failure of any prospective bidder to subscribe. Electronic bids must be received via PARITY in the manner described below, by 9:00 A.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026.

Electronic bids must be submitted via PARITY in accordance with this Official Notice of Sale, by 9:00 A.M., Central Time on the date of sale, and no bid will be received after the time for receiving bids specified above. An electronic bid made through the facilities of PARITY shall be deemed an irrevocable offer to purchase the System Bonds on the terms provided in this Official Notice of Sale and shall be binding upon the bidder as if made by a signed, sealed bid delivered to the District. The District shall not be responsible for any malfunction or mistake made by, or as a result of the use of the facilities of, PARITY, the use of such facilities being the sole risk of the prospective bidder.

If any provisions of this Official Notice of Sale shall conflict with information provided by PARITY as the approved provider of electronic bidding services, this Official Notice of Sale shall control. Further information about PARITY, including any fee charged, may be obtained from i-Deal, 1359 Broadway, 2nd Floor, New York, New York 10018, (212) 849-5000.

For purposes of the electronic bidding process, the time as maintained by PARITY shall constitute the official time. For information purposes only, bidders are requested to state in their electronic bids the net effective interest rate to the District, as described under "CONDITIONS OF SALE—BASIS OF AWARD" below. All electronic bids shall be deemed to incorporate the provisions of this Official Notice of Sale and the Official Bid Form. See "CONDITIONS OF SALE—REQUIRED DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTIES" for additional requirements concerning submission of bids.

TELEPHONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE: Any prospective bidder that intends to submit its bid by telephone must submit its bid in accordance with this section. Prior to 9:00 A.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026, bidders must submit two (2) signed Official Bid Forms, executed by an authorized representative of the bidder but otherwise incomplete, to Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC, Attn: Stephen Eustis, 4801 Woodway Drive, Suite 118-E, Houston, Texas 77056. Bidders who have provided signed bid forms may thereafter submit bids by telephone on the date of sale by 9:00 A.M., Central Time. For purposes of the telephonic bidding process, the time as maintained by PARITY shall constitute the official time. Inquiries with respect to this procedure may be directed to Stephen Eustis of Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC at (713) 600-7535.

Stephen Eustis of Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC will call telephone bidders who have submitted signed Official Bid Forms prior to the date of the sale. Contact Stephen Eustis of Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC, on the day of the sale to obtain the phone number for submission of telephone bids.

LATE BIDS AND IRREGULARITIES: Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC is not authorized and will not be responsible for the submission of any bids made after the time prescribed, nor does the District or Cedar Creek Municipal Advisors LLC assume any responsibility or liability with respect to any irregularities associated with the submission, delivery, or electronic transmission of any bid. **The District and the Board reserve the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any irregularities, except time of filing.**

AWARD AND SALE OF THE SYSTEM BONDS: The Board of the District will take action to adopt an order authorizing the issuance and awarding sale of the System Bonds (the "System Bond Order") or will reject all bids promptly after the opening of bids at 1:00 P.M., Central Time, on Tuesday, August 18, 2026. Please consult the public notice for said meeting for details regarding public access. The District reserves the right to postpone the bond sale if necessary or appropriate. Please note that all bids must comply with the requirements listed in "CONDITIONS OF SALE—REQUIRED DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTIES."

THE SYSTEM BONDS

DESCRIPTION OF CERTAIN TERMS OF THE SYSTEM BONDS: The System Bonds will be dated September 1, 2026 (the "Dated Date"), and will accrue interest from the Date of Delivery, which is expected to be on September 16, 2026 (the "Date of Delivery"), with interest payable on March 1, 2027, and on each September 1 and March 1 thereafter (each an "Interest Payment Date") until the earlier of maturity or prior redemption. The System Bonds will be issued only in fully registered form. Principal is payable to the registered owner(s) of the System Bonds (the "Bondholder(s)") upon presentation and surrender at the principal corporate trust office of the paying agent/registrar, initially, BOKF, NA (the "Paying Agent/Registrar"). Interest on the System Bonds will be payable by check of the Paying Agent/Registrar, dated as of the Interest Payment Date, and mailed by the Paying Agent/Registrar to the Bondholders, as shown on the records of the Paying Agent/Registrar at the close of business on the 15th day of the calendar month next preceding each Interest Payment Date (the

“Record Date”). The System Bonds will be registered in the name of Cede & Co. as nominee for The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York (“DTC”), which will act as securities depository for the System Bonds. Beneficial owners of the System Bonds will not receive physical certificates representing the System Bonds, but will receive a credit balance on the books of the nominees of such beneficial owners. So long as Cede & Co. is the registered owner of the System Bonds, the principal of and interest on the System Bonds will be paid by the Paying Agent/Registrar directly to DTC, which will, in turn, remit such principal and interest to its participants for subsequent disbursement to the beneficial owners of the System Bonds as described herein. See “THE SYSTEM BONDS—Book-Entry-Only System” in the Preliminary Official Statement. The System Bonds will mature serially on September 1 in each of the following years in the following amounts:

SERIAL BONDS AND TERM BONDS: Bidders may provide that all the System Bonds be issued as serial bonds or may provide that any two or more consecutive annual principal amounts may be combined into one or more term bonds.

REDEMPTION PROVISIONS: The System Bonds maturing on and after September 1, 2032, are subject to redemption and payment, at the option of the District, in whole or, from time to time, in part, on September 1, 2031, or on any date thereafter, at a price equal to the principal amount thereof, plus accrued interest thereon to the date fixed for redemption. If less than all the System Bonds are redeemed at any time, the District shall determine the maturity or maturities and the amounts thereof to be redeemed, in integral multiples of \$5,000 in principal amount, and if less than all of the System Bonds within a maturity are to be redeemed, the Paying Agent/Registrar shall select by lot or other customary method of random selection the System Bonds within such maturity to be redeemed. The holder of any Bond, all or a portion of which has been called for redemption, will be required to present such Bond to the Paying Agent/Registrar for payment of the redemption price on the portion of such Bond called for redemption and for the issuance of an exchange Bond in a principal amount equal to the portion of the Bond not so redeemed.

SECURITY FOR PAYMENT: The System Bonds, when issued, will constitute valid and binding obligations of the District, payable as to principal and interest from the proceeds of a continuing, direct annual ad valorem tax, without legal limitation as to rate or amount, levied against taxable property within the District.

OTHER TERMS AND COVENANTS: Other terms of the System Bonds and the various covenants of the District contained in the System Bond Order are described in the Preliminary Official Statement, to which reference is made for all purposes.

MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE AND RATING: The District has made applications to Build America Mutual Assurance Company and Assured Guaranty Municipal Inc. for a commitment for municipal bond guaranty insurance on the System Bonds. The purchase of such insurance, if available, and the payment of all associated costs, including the premium charged by the insurance company and the fees charged by rating companies, other than Moody’s Investors Service, Inc. (“Moody’s”), will be at the option and expense of the System Bond Initial Purchaser (herein defined). The District will pay the rating fees charged by Moody’s. Moody’s has

assigned an underlying credit rating of “Baa3” to the System Bonds. See “MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE” and “RATING” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

TYPES OF BIDS AND INTEREST RATES: The System Bonds will be sold in one block on an “all or none” basis at a price of not less than 97% of the principal amount thereof. Bidders are to name the rates of interest to be borne by the System Bonds, provided that each interest rate bid must be a multiple of 1/8th or 1/20th of 1%. All Bonds maturing within a single year must bear the same rate of interest. The net effective interest rate on the System Bonds, as calculated pursuant to Chapter 1204 of the Texas Government Code, as amended, may not exceed 2% above the Daily Bond Buyer’s weekly “20 Bond Index” published over the one-month period preceding the sale date of the System Bonds. No limitation will be imposed upon bidders as to the number of rates which may be used, but the highest rate bid may not exceed the lowest rate bid by more than 2-1/2% in interest rate. Each bid shall indicate the total and net interest costs in dollars and the net effective interest rate determined therefrom, which shall be considered informative only and not as a part of the bid. No bid generating a cash premium greater than \$5,000 will be accepted.

CLOSING PROCEDURES: The District anticipates use of BaseFund’s “Secured Closing” platform (the “Platform”) to facilitate the Closing. The Platform, on the District’s behalf and upon input by the various transaction parties, assembles and helps verify the accuracy of the participants and their respective payment instructions associated with the Closing (the “Information”), which Information is then memorialized in a “closing memorandum.” At least three days prior to the Closing, the District will cause delivery to the System Bond Initial Purchaser, via email, a URL to the Platform (otherwise, generally accessible at <https://basefund.com/>) that the System Bond Initial Purchaser shall, prior to the Closing, use to access transaction participants’ Information that is necessary to facilitate the Closing. By accessing the Information, the System Bond Initial Purchaser assumes no liability or responsibility for the accuracy of the Information.

BASIS OF AWARD: For the purpose of awarding sale of the System Bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the System Bonds from the date thereof to their respective maturities and adding thereto the discount bid, if any. Subject to the District’s right to reject any or all bids, sale of the System Bonds will be awarded to the bidder (the “System Bond Initial Purchaser”) whose bid, under the above computation, produces the lowest net interest cost to the District. The Board reserves the right to reject any or all bids. In the event of mathematical discrepancies between the interest rate(s) bid and the interest cost determined therefrom, as both appear on the Official Bid Form, the bid will be governed solely by the interest rate(s) bid.

GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT: Each bid must be accompanied by a bank cashier’s check payable to the order of “McKinney Municipal Utility District No. 2 of Collin County” in the amount of \$266,000 which is 2.00% of the par value of the System Bonds (the “Good Faith Deposit”). “Official Checks” will not be accepted. The check of the System Bond Initial Purchaser will be considered as the Good Faith Deposit and will be retained uncashed by the District pending the System Bond Initial Purchaser’s compliance with the terms of the bid. In the event the System Bond Initial Purchaser should fail or refuse to take up and pay for the Bonds in accordance with such terms, or if it is determined that after acceptance of its bid by the District that the System Bond Initial Purchaser was found not to satisfy the requirements regarding the filing of a standing letter with the Office of the Attorney General of Texas (the “Texas Attorney General”) pursuant to All Bond Counsel Letters of the Texas Attorney General and as a result, the Attorney General will not deliver its approving opinion of the Bonds, then the Good Faith Deposit will be cashed and the proceeds accepted by the District as liquidated damages. Subject to “CONDITIONS OF SALE—COMPLIANCE WITH STATE CONTRACTING REQUIREMENTS.” See also “CONDITIONS OF SALE—STANDING LETTER REQUIREMENT.” The Good Faith Deposit may accompany the bid or it may be submitted separately; if submitted separately, it shall be made available to the District prior to the opening of the bids and shall be accompanied by instructions from the bank on which it is drawn which authorize its use as the Good Faith Deposit of bidders named in such instructions. THE GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT OF THE SYSTEM BOND INITIAL PURCHASER WILL BE RETURNED TO THE SYSTEM BOND INITIAL PURCHASER UNCASHED ON THE DATE OF DELIVERY OF THE SYSTEM BONDS. No interest will be credited on the Good Faith Deposit. The checks accompanying all other bids will be returned immediately after the bids are opened and the award of the sale of the System Bonds has been made.

STANDING LETTER REQUIREMENT: Each prospective bidder must have a standing letter on file with the Municipal Advisory Council of Texas and the Texas Attorney General's Office, as required by and compliant in all aspects with, the All Bond Counsel Letters of the Texas Attorney General dated September 22, 2021, November 1, 2023, as supplemented on November 16, 2023, and December 29, 2023, and any All Bond Counsel Letter issued hereafter (collectively, the "All Bond Counsel Letters"). In submitting a bid, a bidder represents to the District that it and each syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form (i) has filed a standing letter that conforms to the requirements set forth in the All Bond Counsel Letters, (ii) It has no reason to believe that the District may not be entitled to rely on the standing letter on file with the Municipal Advisory Council of Texas and the Texas Attorney General's Office, and (iii) neither bidder, any syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form, nor any parent company, subsidiaries, or affiliates of the same, have received a letter from the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts related to its inclusion on any list of financial companies boycotting energy companies. Bidder agrees that it will not rescind its standing letter at any time before the delivery of the Bonds unless same is immediately replaced with a standing letter meeting the requirements of the All Bond Counsel Letters. By submitting a bid, each bidder agrees, should it be the winning bidder, to cooperate with the District and take any action necessary to further verify and confirm compliance with state law by the bidder and each syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form.

The District reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to reject any bid from a bidder that does not have such standing letter on file as of the deadline for bids for the System Bonds. In the event that a bidder does not have such standing letter on file at the time of submission of a bid, the bidder agrees to file such standing letter with the Municipal Advisory Council of Texas and the Texas Attorney General's Office by the earlier of: (a) two (2) hours after submitting its bid, and (b) the deadline for bids for the System Bonds. If requested by the District, the System Bond Initial Purchaser agrees to provide such further representations, certifications or assurances regarding the matters described under the "COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS PROHIBITING DISCRIMINATION AGAINST FOSSIL-FUEL COMPANIES, DISCRIMINATION AGAINST FIREARM ENTITIES AND FIREARMS TRADE ASSOCIATIONS, CONTRACTS WITH COMPANIES BOYCOTTING ISRAEL, AND CONTRACTS WITH CERTAIN COMPANIES IN BUSINESS WITH IRAN, SUDAN OR FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS," as applicable, as of the Date of Delivery of the System Bonds or such other date requested by the District.

A bidder who is currently under review by the Texas Attorney General for being a potential discriminator or boycotter under (i) Section 2271.002 of the Texas Government Code, (ii) Section 2252.152 of the Texas Government Code, (iii) Section 2276.002 of the Texas Government Code, or (iv) Section 2274.002 of the Texas Government Code, agrees to provide, prior to the Date of Delivery of the System Bonds, a bring-down certification that the Texas Attorney General can continue to rely on the bidder's standing letter and the statutory representations and covenants, in accordance with the requirements set forth in the All Bond Counsel Letters.

COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND CERTIFICATE OF SYSTEM BOND INITIAL PURCHASER: In the event that the District does not receive sufficient qualified bids to satisfy the competitive sale requirements of Treasury Regulation § 1.148-1(f)(3)(i), the "hold-the-offering-price rule" shall apply, which will allow the District to treat the initial offering price to the public of each maturity as of the sale date as the issue price of that maturity (the "hold-the-offering-price rule"). So long as the hold-the-offering-price rule applies to any maturity of the System Bonds, the System Bond Initial Purchaser will neither offer nor sell that maturity to any person at a price that is higher than the initial offering price to the public during the period starting on the sale date and ending on the earlier of the following: (a) the date on which the System Bond Initial Purchaser has sold at least 10 percent of that maturity of the System Bonds to the public at a price that is no higher than the initial offering price to the public or (b) the close of the fifth business day after the sale date.

The System Bond Initial Purchaser agrees to promptly report to the District's Financial Advisor when it has sold 10 percent of a maturity of the System Bonds to the public at a price that is no higher than the initial offering price to the public if that occurs prior to the close of the fifth business day after the sale date. Alternative Certificates of System Bond Initial Purchaser are attached for use (I) when the competitive sale requirements of Treasury Regulation § 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) are met and (II) when such requirements are not met.

REQUIRED DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTIES: Bidders, including any syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form, who are not publicly traded business entities, or wholly-owned subsidiaries of a publicly traded business entity, must submit to the District a completed and signed Texas Ethics Commission Form 1295

("TEC Form 1295") in accordance with Texas Government Code Section § 2252.908. If required, the TEC Form 1295 may accompany the Official Bid Form or may be submitted separately, but must be provided to the District prior to the time prescribed for the award of the System Bonds. If required the TEC Form 1295 may be provided to the District via facsimile or electronically; however, the original signed TEC Form 1295, including the certificate number, must be physically delivered to the District within two business days of the award. The District reserves the right to reject any bid that does not comply with the requirements prescribed herein, if applicable, or to waive any such requirements. For purposes of completing the TEC Form 1295, box two is "McKinney Municipal Utility District No. 2 of Collin County" and box 3 is "MCKMUD2-S2026-B." Neither the District nor its consultants have the ability to verify the information included in a TEC Form 1295, and neither have an obligation nor undertake responsibility for advising any bidder with respect to the proper completion of the TEC Form 1295. Consequently, any entity which is not a publicly traded business entity, or a wholly-owned subsidiary of a publicly traded business entity, should consult its own advisors to the extent it deems necessary and be prepared to submit the completed form promptly upon notification from the District that its bid is the apparent winning bid.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS PROHIBITING DISCRIMINATION AGAINST FOSSIL-FUEL COMPANIES, DISCRIMINATION AGAINST FIREARM ENTITIES AND FIREARMS TRADE ASSOCIATIONS, CONTRACTS WITH COMPANIES BOYCOTTING ISRAEL, AND CONTRACTS WITH CERTAIN COMPANIES IN BUSINESS WITH IRAN, SUDAN OR FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS: The District will not award the System Bonds to a bidder unless the bidder and any syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form and any parent company, wholly-owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, and affiliate represents, and if the bid is accepted, covenants that, for the purposes of sections 2252.152, 2271.002, 2274.002, and 2276.002, Texas Government Code, as amended, the bidder, any syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form, any parent company, wholly-owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, and affiliate:

- a. Do not boycott energy companies and will not boycott energy companies during the term of such contracts. "Boycott energy company" has the meaning provided in section 809.001 of the Texas Government Code.
- b. Do not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association and will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of such contracts. "Discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association" has the meaning provided in section 2274.001(3) of the Texas Government Code. "Firearm entity" and "firearm trade association" have the meanings provided in section 2274.001(6) and (7) of the Texas Government Code.
- c. Do not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of such contracts. "Boycott Israel" has the meaning provided in section 808.001 of the Texas Government Code.
- d. Unless affirmatively declared by the United States government to be excluded from its federal sanctions regime relating to Sudan, its federal sanctions regime relating to Iran, or any federal sanctions regime relating to a foreign terrorist organization, are not identified on a list prepared and maintained by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts under section 2252.153 or section 2270.0201 of the Texas Government Code.

For the purposes of this section, "Affiliate" means any entity that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with the Purchaser within the meaning of SEC Rule 405, 17. C.F.R. § 230.405 and exists to make a profit.

By submitting a bid, a bidder makes and certifies to the representations necessary and convenient for compliance with the aforementioned laws and agrees to execute further written certificates as may be necessary or convenient for the District to establish compliance with the aforementioned laws.

Liability for breach of any such verification provided in connection with the purchase of the Road Bonds shall survive until barred by the applicable statute of limitations, and shall not be liquidated or otherwise limited by any provision of the Bond Resolution, this Official Notice of Sale and the Official Bid Form, notwithstanding anything in the Bond Resolution, this Official Notice of Sale or the Official Bid Form to the contrary.

Liability for breach of the standing letter requirements and the statutory representations and covenants required by Chapters 2252, 2271, 2274, and 2276 of the Texas Government Code shall survive until barred by

the applicable statute of limitations, and will not be liquidated or otherwise limited by any provision of this Official Notice of Sale and Official Bid Form, notwithstanding anything in this Official Notice of Sale or Official Bid Form to the contrary.

CONTRACTING INFORMATION: The District will not award the System Bonds to a bidder unless the bidder verifies on behalf of itself and each syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form that pursuant to Section 552.371 of the Texas Government Code, as amended, the bidder and each syndicate member listed on the Official Bid Form will (i) preserve all contracting information related to the bid as provided by the records retention requirements applicable to the District through the delivery date of the System Bonds, (ii) promptly provide to the District any contracting information related to the bid that is in the custody or possession of the bidder or any syndicate member on request of the District, and (iii) upon delivery of the System Bonds to the bidder, either (a) provide at no cost to the District all contracting information related to the bid that is in the custody or possession of the bidder or any syndicate member or (b) preserve the contracting information related to the bid as provided by the records retention requirements applicable to the District. The term “contracting information” as used in this paragraph has the meaning assigned to such term in Section 552.003 of the Texas Government Code.

By submitting a bid, a bidder makes and certifies to the representations necessary and convenient for compliance with the aforementioned laws and agrees to execute further written certificates as may be necessary or convenient for the District to establish compliance with the aforementioned laws.

OFFICIAL STATEMENT

To assist the System Bond Initial Purchaser in complying with Rule 15c2-12 (the “Rule”) of the Securities Exchange Act of the United States Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”), the District and the System Bond Initial Purchaser contract and agree, by the submission and acceptance of the winning bid, as follows:

FINAL OFFICIAL STATEMENT: The District has approved and authorized distribution of the accompanying Preliminary Official Statement for dissemination to potential purchasers of the System Bonds, but does not presently intend to prepare any other document or version thereof for such purpose, except as described below. Accordingly, the District intends the Preliminary Official Statement to be final as of its date, within the meaning of the Rule (b)(1), except for information relating to the offering prices, interest rates, final debt service schedule, selling compensation, identity of the System Bond Initial Purchaser and other similar information, terms and provisions to be specified in the competitive bidding process. The System Bond Initial Purchaser shall be responsible for promptly informing the District of the initial offering yields of the System Bonds. Thereafter, the District will complete and authorize distribution of the Official Statement identifying the System Bond Initial Purchaser and containing such omitted information. The District does not otherwise intend to amend or supplement the Official Statement, except to take into account certain subsequent events, if any, as described below. By delivering the final Official Statement or any amendment or supplement thereto in the requested quantity to the System Bond Initial Purchaser on or after the sale date, the District intends the same to be final as of such date, within the meaning of the Rule. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the only representations concerning the absence of material misstatements or omissions from the Official Statement which are being or which will be made by the District are those described and contained in the Official Statement under the caption “OFFICIAL STATEMENT—Certification as to Official Statement.”

CHANGES TO OFFICIAL STATEMENT: If, subsequent to the date of the Official Statement, the District learns, through the ordinary course of business and without undertaking any investigation or examination for such purposes, or is notified by the System Bond Initial Purchaser of any adverse event which causes the Official Statement to be materially misleading, and unless the System Bond Initial Purchaser elects to terminate its obligation to purchase the System Bonds, as described below under “DELIVERY AND ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTS— CONDITIONS TO DELIVERY,” the District will promptly prepare and supply to the System Bond Initial Purchaser an appropriate amendment or supplement to the Official Statement satisfactory to the System Bond Initial Purchaser; provided, however, that the obligation of the District to do so will terminate when the District delivers the System Bonds to the System Bond Initial Purchaser, unless the System Bond Initial Purchaser notifies the District on or before such date that less than all of the System Bonds have been sold to ultimate customers, in which case the District’s obligations hereunder will extend for an additional period of time (but not more than 90 days after the date the District delivers the System Bonds) until all of the System Bonds have been sold to ultimate customers.

DELIVERY OF OFFICIAL STATEMENTS: The District shall furnish to the System Bond Initial Purchaser (and to each participating underwriter of the System Bonds, within the meaning of the Rule, designated by the System Bond Initial Purchaser), within seven (7) business days after the sale date, the aggregate number of Official Statements specified in the winning bid. The District also shall furnish to the System Bond Initial Purchaser a like number of any supplements or amendments approved and authorized for distribution by the District for dissemination to potential purchasers of the System Bonds, as well as such additional copies of the Official Statement or any such supplements or amendments as the System Bond Initial Purchaser may request prior to the 90th day after the end of the underwriting period described in the Rule (e)(2). The District shall pay the expense of preparing the number of copies of the Official Statement specified in the winning bid and an equal number of any supplements or amendments issued on or before the delivery date, but the System Bond Initial Purchaser shall pay for all other copies of the Official Statement or any supplement or amendment thereto.

DELIVERY AND ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTS

DELIVERY OF INITIAL BONDS: Initial delivery of the System Bonds (“Initial Delivery”) will be as set forth below. Unless otherwise agreed to by the System Bond Initial Purchaser, delivery will be at the corporate trust office of the Paying Agent/Registrar in Dallas, Texas. Payment for the System Bonds must be made in immediately available funds for unconditional credit to the District, or as otherwise directed by the District. If for any reason the District is unable to make delivery on or before October 15, 2026, then the District immediately shall contact the System Bond Initial Purchaser and offer to allow the System Bond Initial Purchaser to extend its offer for an additional thirty (30) days. If the System Bond Initial Purchaser does not elect to extend its offer within six (6) days thereafter, then the Good Faith Deposit will be returned, and both the District and the System Bond Initial Purchaser shall be relieved of any further obligation.

EXCHANGE ON DELIVERY DATE: Upon written request of the System Bond Initial Purchaser, delivered to the Paying Agent/Registrar not less than five (5) business days prior to the date fixed for delivery, the Paying Agent/Registrar will, on the delivery date, exchange the System Bonds to be delivered by the District for Bonds registered in accordance with instructions contained in such request, in integral multiples of \$5,000, maturing as set out in this Official Notice of Sale and bearing interest in accordance with the terms of the System Bond Initial Purchaser’s bid.

CUSIP NUMBERS: It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on the System Bonds, but neither the failure to print such number on any Bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the System Bond Initial Purchaser to accept delivery of and pay for the System Bonds in accordance with the terms of this Official Notice of Sale. All expenses relating to the printing of CUSIP numbers on the System Bonds shall be paid for by the District; however, payment of the CUSIP Global Services charge for the assignment of the numbers shall be the responsibility of the System Bond Initial Purchaser.

CONDITIONS TO DELIVERY: The obligation to take up and pay for the System Bonds is subject to the following conditions: the issuance of an approving opinion of the Attorney General of Texas; the System Bond Initial Purchaser’s receipt of the initial Bonds (or definitive Bonds if the System Bond Initial Purchaser has provided the Paying Agent/Registrar with registration instructions as provided above); the System Bond Initial Purchaser’s receipt of the legal opinion of Sanford Kuhl Hagan Kugle Parker Kahn LLP, Houston, Texas, Bond Counsel; the no-litigation certificate; and the non-occurrence of the events described below under “NO MATERIAL ADVERSE CHANGE,” all as described below. Further, the System Bond Initial Purchaser is not obligated to take up and pay for the System Bonds at Initial Delivery if at any time after the award of the System Bonds and at or prior to Initial Delivery, the President or Congress of the United States, as applicable, shall have declared war or a national emergency. In addition, if the District fails to comply with its obligations described

under “OFFICIAL STATEMENT” above, the System Bond Initial Purchaser may terminate its contract to purchase the System Bonds by delivering written notice to the District within five (5) days thereafter.

SYSTEM BOND INITIAL PURCHASER’S CERTIFICATION OF ISSUE PRICE: In order to provide the District with information required to enable it to comply with certain conditions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”), relating to the exclusion of interest on the System Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and subject to the section entitled “CONDITIONS OF SALE—COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND CERTIFICATE OF SYSTEM BOND INITIAL PURCHASER” herein, the System Bond Initial Purchaser will be required to complete, execute and deliver to the District (on or before the Date of Delivery of the System Bonds) a certification regarding the “issue price” of the System Bonds substantially in one of the forms accompanying this Official Notice of Sale. In the event the System Bond Initial Purchaser will not reoffer the System Bonds for sale or is unable to sell a substantial amount of the System Bonds of any maturity by the Date of Delivery, such certificate may be modified in a manner acceptable to the District. Each bidder, by submitting its bid, agrees to complete, execute, and deliver such a certificate by the Date of Delivery of the System Bonds, if its bid is accepted by the District. It will be the responsibility of the System Bond Initial Purchaser to institute such syndicate reporting requirements, to make such investigation, or otherwise to ascertain the facts necessary to enable it to make such certification with reasonable certainty. Any questions concerning such certification should be directed to Bond Counsel. See “TAX MATTERS” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

LEGAL OPINIONS: The District will furnish to the System Bond Initial Purchaser a transcript of certain certified proceedings incident to the issuance and authorization of the System Bonds, including a certified copy of the approving legal opinion of the Attorney General of Texas, as recorded in the Bond Register of the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas, to the effect that the Attorney General of Texas has examined a transcript of proceedings authorizing the issuance of the System Bonds, and that based upon such examination, the System Bonds are valid and binding obligations of the District payable from the proceeds of an annual ad valorem tax, levied without legal limitation as to rate or amount upon all taxable property in the District. The District will also furnish the approving legal opinion of Bond Counsel, to the effect that, based upon an examination of such transcript, the System Bonds are valid and binding obligations of the District under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, except to the extent that enforcement of the rights and remedies of the registered owners of the System Bonds may be limited by laws relating to bankruptcy, reorganization, or other similar laws of general application affecting the rights of creditors of political subdivisions such as the District. The legal opinion of Bond Counsel will further state that the System Bonds are payable, both as to principal and interest, from the levy of ad valorem taxes without legal limitation as to rate or amount, upon all taxable property within the District, and that the interest on the System Bonds is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes under existing law and interest on the System Bonds is not subject to the alternative minimum tax. See “LEGAL MATTERS” in the Preliminary Official Statement. Such opinions express no opinion with respect to the sufficiency of the security for or marketability of the System Bonds.

DTC DEFINITIVE BONDS: After delivery, the System Bonds will be issued in Book-Entry-Only form. Cede & Co. is the nominee for DTC. All references herein to the registered owners of the System Bonds shall mean Cede & Co. and not the beneficial owners of the System Bonds. Purchase of beneficial interests in the System Bonds will be made in Book-Entry-Only form (without registered Bonds) in the denomination of \$5,000 principal amount or any integral multiple thereof. Under certain limited circumstances described herein, the District may determine to forego immobilization of the System Bonds at DTC, or another securities depository, in which case such beneficial interests would become exchangeable for one or more fully registered Bonds of like principal amount for the System Bonds. See “THE SYSTEM BONDS— Book-Entry-Only System” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

NOT QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS: The District will not designate the System Bonds as “qualified tax-exempt obligations” within the meaning of Section 265 (b) of the Code.

NO-LITIGATION CERTIFICATE: With the delivery of the System Bonds, the President and Secretary of the Board will, on behalf of the District, execute and furnish to the System Bond Initial Purchaser a certificate to the effect that no litigation of any nature has been filed or is then pending against the District, of which the District has notice, to restrain the issuance or delivery of the System Bonds, or which would affect the provisions made for their payment or security, or in any manner questioning the validity of the System Bonds.

NO MATERIAL ADVERSE CHANGE: The obligations of the System Bond Initial Purchaser to take up and pay for the System Bonds, and of the District to deliver the System Bonds, are subject to the condition that, up to the time of delivery of and receipt of payment for the System Bonds, there shall have been no material adverse change in the condition of the District (financial or otherwise) subsequent to the date of sale from that set forth in the Preliminary Official Statement, as it may have been finalized, supplemented or amended through the Date of Delivery.

GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

INVESTMENT CONSIDERATIONS: The System Bonds are subject to investment risks as set forth in the accompanying Preliminary Official Statement. Prospective purchasers should review the entire Preliminary Official Statement before making an investment decision. See “INVESTMENT CONSIDERATIONS” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

RESERVATION OF RIGHTS: **The District reserves the right to reject all bids or any bid not conforming with the terms hereof and the right to waive any and all irregularities, except time of filing.**

NOT AN OFFER TO SELL: This Official Notice of Sale does not alone constitute an offer to sell the System Bonds but is merely notice of sale of the System Bonds. The invitation for bids on the System Bonds is being made by means of this Official Notice of Sale, the Preliminary Official Statement, and the Official Bid Form.

SECURITIES REGISTRATION AND QUALIFICATION: No registration statement relating to the System Bonds has been filed with the SEC under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended, in reliance upon exemptions provided thereunder. The System Bonds have not been registered or qualified under the Securities Act of Texas in reliance upon various exemptions contained therein; nor have the System Bonds been registered or qualified under the securities laws or regulations of any other jurisdiction. The District assumes no responsibility for registration or qualification of the System Bonds under the securities laws or regulations of any other jurisdiction in which the System Bonds may be offered, sold or otherwise transferred. This disclaimer of responsibility for registration or qualification for sale or other disposition of the System Bonds shall not be construed as an interpretation of any kind with regard to the availability of any exemption from securities registration or qualification provisions in such other jurisdictions.

By submission of a bid, the System Bond Initial Purchaser represents that the sale of the System Bonds in states other than Texas will be made only pursuant to exemptions from registration or qualification or, where necessary, the System Bond Initial Purchaser will register or qualify the System Bonds in accordance with the securities laws or regulations of any jurisdiction which so requires. The District agrees to cooperate, at the System Bond Initial Purchaser's written request and expense, in registering or qualifying the System Bonds, or in obtaining an exemption from registration or qualification, in any jurisdiction where such action is necessary.

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT: The District will agree in the System Bond Order to provide certain periodic information and notices of material events in accordance with the Rule, as described in the Preliminary Official Statement under “CONTINUING DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION.” The System Bond Initial Purchaser's obligation to accept and pay for the System Bonds is conditioned upon delivery to the System Bond Initial Purchaser or its agent of a certified copy of the System Bond Order containing the agreement described under such heading.
